Practice Management:

Familiarity with all aspects of pharmacy management, including personnel, regulatory requirements, and medical informatics.

Drug Information:

Drug information requests, utilize various information resources, participate in journal club, develop medication use policies, perform drug usage evaluations, attend P&T Committee meetings, evaluate adverse drug events, and provide educational presentations (including at least one continuing education presentation).

Residency Project:

Residents will design, implement, and complete a project of their choice in conjunction with a project advisor. The project will be presented at the Midwest Residency Conference and be publishable.

Teaching Opportunities:

Educational affiliations will provide opportunities for the resident to precept pharmacy students and teach didactic or lab classes. A teaching certificate is also available for the resident to complete.

Teaching opportunities: Educational affiliations will provide opportunities for the resident to precept pharmacy students and obtain a teaching certificate from South Dakota State University (SDSU).

Practice Management: This learning experience covers many practice management topics which includes: budgeting, personnel management, regulatory requirements, and medical informatics.

Residency Project: Residents will design, implement, and complete a project of their choice in conjunction with a project advisor. The project will be presented at the ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting, Midwest Residency Conference and be publishable.

Drug Information: Activities include but are not limited to answering drug information requests, participating in journal club, developing medication use policies, performing medication use evaluations, attending P&T Committee meetings (locally and possibly regionally), evaluating adverse drug events, and providing educational presentations to colleagues, including at least one continuing education presentation.

Practice Coverage: Provides experience working as a pharmacist, improving skills in the medication use process. As a pharmacist, residents must have a thorough understanding of the medication ordering/delivery system utilized by the individual institution to be fully successful. A pharmacist will be available to assist the resident with any questions that arise during practice coverage.
