

**Practice Management:**

During this time, the resident will become familiar with all aspects of pharmacy management, including personnel management, regulatory requirements, and medical informatics.

**Drug Information:**

Residents will answer drug information requests, utilize various information resources, participate in journal club, develop medication use policies, perform drug usage evaluations, attend P&T Committee meetings, evaluate adverse drug events, and provide educational presentations to colleagues, including one grand rounds presentation.

**Residency Project:**

Residents will design, implement, and complete a project of their choice in conjunction with a project advisor. The project will be presented at the Midwest Residency Conference and be publishable.

**Teaching opportunities:** Educational affiliations will provide opportunities for the resident to precept pharmacy students and teach didactic or lab classes
